

About us

Dogs Trust Freedom Project is a dog fostering service for people fleeing domestic abuse. We know that pet owners fleeing domestic abuse are often unable to take their dogs into a refuge with them so in many cases, they may feel unable to leave their home until they know there is somewhere safe for their pets too. Dogs Trust offers a solution by providing free and confidential foster care, enabling the owner to flee, safe in the knowledge that their dog will be loved and cared for until they can be reunited.



The statistics

Since 2004, we have helped over **1,100 PEOPLE** to flee domestic abuse by fostering **1,400 DOGS**



On average the police in England and Wales receive **OVER 100 CALLS** relating to domestic abuse **EVERY HOUR**.

In **2017/18**, Police Scotland recorded almost **60,000 CASES** of domestic abuse.

On average **TWO WOMEN** are **KILLED** by their partner or ex-partner **EACH WEEK** in England and Wales.


A survey carried out by Dogs Trust in 2019 showed that:

Grooming



Dog equipment such as toys, bedding, collars and leads



Veterinary fees, such as preventative treatments and any veterinary care the dog may need if they become unwell

A dog's journey

1 We receive a referral and will match the dog to a foster home.

2 We liaise with the owner and their support service to collect the dog from a safe location.

3 The dog is placed straight into a loving volunteer foster home and given time to settle in.

4 The dog receives a full health check and will be neutered, vaccinated and microchipped.

5 We visit the dog regularly and send the owner updates and photos.
6 As soon as the owner is safely rehoused, we will collect and reunite their dog.
